### MINUTES OF 2011 BUSINESS MEETING

The business meeting of 9<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion Association, USMC was called to order by President Herb Shaw at 0900 in the hospitality room at the Holiday Inn Riverview in Charleston, South Carolina on June 14, 2011.

Approximately 40 members were present.

Officers present were: President Herb Shaw

The invocation was given by Chaplain Mickey Ryan.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Joe Malinowski.

Reading of the minutes of the last meeting was waved due to their posting in the last newsletter.

Under old business, Bob Nilsson gave us a report on the National Medical Centers:

- On behalf of the wounded veterans, he thanked us for the ten computers we donated to them
- He stated that there are currently 1500 amputees from Iraq and Afghanistan in the nation's hospitals
- There is currently a program at Bethesda called "100 Entrepreneurs" to assist the wounded in making the transition to civilian life
- There is another program started by Lt. Col Tim Maxwell to provide a retreat for the wounded in Lunenburg, Virginia and invited us to check it out at www.sempermax.com
- Other concerns were discussed about TBI, family support, the VA and drugs

#### Under new business:

- Herb Shaw presented Bob Nilsson a plaque from us for all the work he is doing with the Wounded Warriors
- A copy of the Treasurer's Report was given to all members. This was submitted by Eric Kenny via email with regrets that he could not attend the reunion
  - A motion was made by Don Gurganus to accept the report,
     seconded by George Ingalls and accepted by a unanimous vote
- The scholarship program was discussed, pointing out that, to date, no applications were received
- The next reunion was discussed with Herb Shaw pointing out that we haven't been to the west coast in several years
  - A motion to have the 2012 reunion in Las Vegas and the 2013 reunion at Camp Lejune was made by Frank Cooper, seconded by George Ingalls, and passed by a unanimous vote
- Herb Shaw solicited a committee to audit the reunion financial report with Joe Malinowski, Frank Cooper, and George Ingalls volunteering
- Membership cards were discussed with Fred DuPont pointing out that it is cost prohibitive due to the 50 cents it would cost to mail each one
